

Dear Family and Friends,

We arrived safely in Kenya at 10:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 23. We were greeted by 12 people at the airport with four cars to carry us and our luggage home. It was a sweet welcome home. Our stay in London helped with the jetlag. It didn't take as long as last time to adjust to the 10 hour time difference from Arizona to Kenya. The Mestlers and a few people helped get our house ready for us. We were able to get in and unpack a little and then go to sleep in beds that were made and ready for us and, of course, equipped with mosquito nets.

The most difficult part of our arrival was the fact that our house has no water running through the pipes. There is a drought in the area. Please pray for rain; the clouds come in like it's going to storm and then let out a little drizzle before they go floating away. After being here for three days I realized that I am better with the electricity going out than no water. It brings its challenges, especially with little children.

There have been a few changes in the last four years but a lot has remained the same. We will be getting an Internet connection and phones hooked up soon. Please be patient as sometimes these things take longer than expected. We will be getting a prayer letter out as soon as we get everything set up.

The kids are adjusting very well. They have enjoyed playing with the toys we left here years ago. They have made a friend in the area and I'm sure will make many more soon.

The roads are as bad as we remembered, although they are doing construction on some of them. Please pray for us as we continue to get things set up and make it home again. We now have a 5000 liter tank outside in our front lawn and a plumber will be setting us up to pump water from the tank to our pipes on Monday. Pray everything goes well with that.
